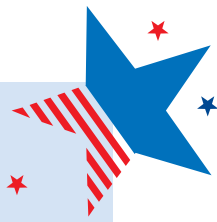

The 2007 National Scholarship Benefit program will award up to \$30,000 for the 2007–08 academic year. If you are a college-bound student who enjoys helping others through volunteering, you may be eligible to win a \$1,000 scholarship.

To apply, you must be:

1. A member of National Mutual Benefit, insured under your own life insurance policy or annuity contract, by the application deadline;
2. A graduating high school senior in the class of 2007, or a student enrolling full-time in an accredited college or technical school; and
3. Age 25 or younger.

Completed application materials must be postmarked on or before **February 28, 2007**. Scholarships are not renewable, but you may apply each year. An individual member may receive up to two national scholarships.
